In-form Livvy Hoskins slotted the ball into the bottom corner from a drag flick getting the away side level. The game started to really open up with both sides searching for the win, a quick free hit taken by Phoebe Richards caught the home side off guard allowing her space to pop the ball into the defensive circle for Amy Burton to slot the ball underneath the homes side defence where Eloise Laity jumped in front to tuck the ball home in the 62nd minute to secure the 3pts for Clifton.


