At the bottom end, both Cardiff sides sadly were relegated to make a very Welsh-Centric West Prem next season.

Meanwhile, both of today's sides have ended up comfortably mid table. Clifton Robinsons have seen an uptick in form since Christmas and can finish 5th if they follow up on last week's top performance against 2nd place Isca. Meanwhile, Exeter Uni are marooned in 4th, but will be wanting to finish strong. The reverse fixture was a close affair with a 1-0 win for the greens, but fans will be hoping for a goal fest more similar to recent games!



Previously for the M1... CRHC 6 - 3 Isca

The penultimate game of the season was a successful one for Clifton Robinsons, who ran out 6-3 winners over Isca. Isca have had a strong 2022/23 season, sitting second in the league having lost out to Havant in the promotion race the previous weekend. This fixture presented a real opportunity for Clifton to show the steady progress made during the second half of the season, and ultimately set out a marker for next years' ambitions.

Robbies started the game slowly, and Isca captalised with a goal after just 5 minutes. The reaction from this point on however was excellent, and Clifton scored the next 4 goals. Toby Rowlings opened the Blues' goal tally with a delicate near post finish from the base line. This was followed up with two penalty corner flicks from Tom Salmon and Tim Atkins, and finally Isaac Hocking nabbing the fourth. On the stroke of half time, Cuthbert Shepherd scored his second of the game for Isca to make it 4-2 and keep the neutrals interested.

In the second half Clifton continued to drive home their dominance and on 43 minutes Nick Robilliard showed some lovely wobble to finish on the reverse. Isca scored a consolation goal on 65 minutes before Ken Gainsford completed the scoring in 69th minute, a fine reward for an excellent overall team display.

Clifton Robinsons now sit 7th in the table, with an opportunity of a top half finish on Sunday if results go the right way.




