Committee news

GRHC & Grays Hockey

Clifton Robinsons is Grays Hockey's main club for their kit and equipment. We have our own Kit Webshop through the ClubBuzz website system, which gives ALL Club members access to Grays' own products, with significant discount.

How does it work? Our partnership with Grays means that all CRHC kit, bought through the webshop, comes at a pre-discounted price. While this means that we can't apply a further discount to our branded kit, everything else that Grays sells, accessed via the webshop, is available at a discount of 20% – that's all Grays clothing, sticks and protection equipment – by using a discount code (contact me to access it) applied at checkout. Furthermore, players (usually performance players, specifically) can apply to Grays for Player Sponsorship, giving additional discounts, or even a Cash Equivalent Allowance, which is granted to buy such things as sticks and bags.

How to get the benefit: Simply go to the CRHC website and click on "About Us". Select "Kit" from the dropdown menu and then click on the link to the Grays Hockey Shop that appears on our Kit page.

This takes you to the CRHC Grays webshop. At the top of the page are the adult matchday shirts that you can order through me to include your player number (I send regular, club-wide emails calling for orders for these). Beneath this is all the other CRHC branded clothing, which you can order yourselves directly, with no postage costs and no minimum order.

From here, you can navigate to all the other hockey goodies that Grays offers. Please contact me directly on the email below for the discount code that you need to apply.

Something missing? Grays and I are in constant contact, aiming to make sure you have access to the CRHC clothing you need. For example, since the FIH/EH ruling to permit women to wear a skort or shorts during competition, I've been working with Grays to provide CRHC women's shorts. Similarly, we're working hard to improve the quality of the skorts in the range. Women's 1s Pre-season Success!

Our Women's 1s have had a good workout preparing for the season playing other National League sides and culminating in a highly successful Beeston Tournament.

To start off Club Day, the women played their first game on the Clifton College pitch, following their move from Coombe Dingle. They played a strong Reading side that included a Rio Gold Medallist. The Clifton side was a mixture of experienced 1st-team players and some young players gaining valuable experience. In a typically close game against Reading, the opposition emerged winners by three goals to two. The CRHC goals were scored by Abi Porter and Amy Burton.

In the midweek following, the women played away in the heat against Gloucester. A number of players returned from their summer break, many of whom had been on international duty in the Euros (with a few bronze medals to show) over most of the time since the close of the 2022/23 season. Goals from Amy Burton, Rebecca Daniel (on her debut for the club) and Evie Grindal, and a Gloucester own goal gave CRHC a 4–1 win.

All that meant that our W1s were well prepared for the weekend pre-season tournament against some stiff opposition at Beeston. Nonetheless, our side had a lot to live up to, as we were defending our title. The women played three group games on the Saturday and two on the Sunday.

The results were:

CRHC W15 - Guildford W10

CRHC W12 - Beeston W10

CRHC W1 1 - Isca W1 1

CRHC W11 - Reading W11

CRHC W11 - University of Nottingham W10

Unbeaten in 5 games, scoring 10 and conceding only 2, meant we topped the group with 11 points. CRHC were up against our old rivals Reading in the final – this time victorious by 2–0. The goals came from Evie Grindal and Livvy Hoskins.

Our group-stage goal-scorers were: Amy Burton 2, Livvy Hoskins 2, Evie Grindal 2, Clemmie Houlden, Sara Davies and Ellie Laity 2.

Congratulations to our Welsh contingent, many of whom spent the close season playing for Wales in various tournaments. CRHC had 7 players in the Welsh squad that won a magnificent Bronze in Prague: Livvy Hoskins, Phoebe Richards, Holly Munro, Ellie Laity, Izzie Webb, Rebecca Daniel (then Durham Uni) and Emily Drysdale. Wales came from 2–0 down in the Bronze Medal match to draw 2–2 and then win bronze 3–0 in the shootout – with our own Phoebe Richards and Livvy Hoskins scoring.

Jess Lea made her Welsh debut in the Hockey 5s in Walcz Poland. Jess played in all 6 games and scored 3 goals.

Congratulations also to ex-CRHC player Leah Wilkinson who was this week inducted into the Welsh Hall of Fame.

Premiership Opener 23/24 - W1s vs Isca & Uni of Exeter

The W1s travelled to Exeter for a West Country Derby in Week 1 of the Vitality Premier League, and the opening match of the Premier League season.

CRHC were hoping to continue on from their excellent fourth place last year, while Isca/Uni of Exeter were making their first appearance ever in the top flight. Clifton fielded two debutants on the day: Welsh International Rebecca Daniel, who has joined from Durham University and England age-group player Evie Grindal. As expected, Isca came out hard, trying to make an impression, but the CRHC side's greater experience gradually took control. CRHC were confident in possession, building from the back and looking work opportunities in the D. The first quarter was goaless but Clifton broke the deadlock in the 27th minute after a sublime run from Ellie Laity set up Livvy Hoskins to convert from close range.

After 44 minutes, Livvy doubled the lead with a drag flick into the left corner of the goal. Both Ellie Laity and Evie Grindal went close in the second half, forcing the Isca goalkeeper to make two good saves. In the last quarter Isca threw everything at Clifton and had a number of PCs before the final whistle. The defence held strong with some good saves made by our captain and goalkeeper Aline de Visser. Congratulations to Player of the Match, Emily Drysdale, for her outstanding performance. As we go into the second weekend of fixtures, CRHC W1s are enjoying their place at the top of the league table.
