LAST TIME OUT: CRHC 3 - 2 CHICHESTER

Clifton Robinsons hosted Chichester at Clifton College, running out 3-2 victors on Sunday. Coach David Hacker in his usual calm and collected style laid out the tactics and formation ahead of the game welcoming Ben Stone, Stu Loughrey & Tom Salmon back in to the fold.

A packed sideline at Clifton welcomed the players, both sides warmed up and at the coin toss Davidson elected to start with the ball, Robbies would defend their favoured end of the ground for the first half.

Davidson gathered the troops in for one last talk and the umpires got proceedings underway. Robbies immediately looked to get onto the front foot keeping the ball, Chichester though countered this with a tight compact formation, they knew they had to weather the initial storm, with Robbie's looking to expose Chichester with the pace of Naughton, Stone and Coombe up top.

With Evans patrolling in front of the backline, Chichester were finding it hard to get into the final third of the pitch, Stevens & Salmon stuck to their men like glue not allowing them the chance to receive any ball. Chichester were trying to play at a frantic pace but Robbies continued to frustrate them, the game being punctuated by chances and opportunities in the opening quarter. With the attack minded full backs Loughrey and Wiseman starting to see more of the ball, the hosts started to get a foothold in the game, pressing down the flanks and linking well with the forward line. The midfield battle was closely contested, the hard running Pinnell & Skelton finding their feet. It was Robbies who opened the scoring from a short comer, won by Francuz & Smithard dispatching his drag flick low and hard past the away keeper.

Into the second quarter, & it didn't take long for Robbies to double their lead in the game. Next on the scoresheet was Francuz who got in front of his defender to deflect a rifled ball in from Loughrey leaving the keeper & defender in disarray. Half Time 2-0.

With the score now 3-0, Robbies now had the cushion they needed to try and control the game, but the visitors were not finished yet. CM Conor Pinnell was sent to the sin bin with a green card for some over exuberant tackles . Chichester then scored mid way through the third quarter. Taking advantage of some lacklustre marking a ball was played into the top of the D, turning and finishing low through a crowd of players into the bottom corner.

With the lead now not so comfortable, Robbies were not to have it all their own way, Francuz was next on the naughty step for a bad challenge on Chichester's #4. Robbies were slightly rattled by this setback due to not having been in this position many times this season, they just needed to get hold of the Ball and keep it. Chichester finally got their reward through a scrappy goal, a forward player managed to evade 2 tackles as he broke forward, getting his pass away to a team mate in the D who miss controlled the ball but in doing so turned it toward goal giving himself a 1 yard tap in to bring the visitors level at 3-2.
